to clients hugging me for winning their cases or often just for being the first person to help them

in a long time, I could not have asked for a more fitting position.

My work schedule was perfect—8 a.m. to 5 p.m. every day, and during times where we

had an increased workload, I was allowed to take work home. This was mainly a result of my

own self-motivation. You see, whenever I had a hearing or brief submission coming up, I would

create several dozens of copies of either briefs or opening statements. Since I dealt with a

number of homeless veterans, and my brother is himself a veteran, I felt a special motivation for
