I am very grateful for the Equal Justice America summer fellowship that allowed me to intern at LatinoJustice PRLDEF ("LJP"), one of the leading civil rights organizations in the country. Moreover, I really enjoyed connecting with the community and presenting to health advocates on the medical benefits immigrants are eligible for. Providing this information is vital in helping improve the quality of life of Latinos and their families.

The LJP internship was more than I had expected. I was able to participate in informative brown bag lunches on topics such as post-graduate fellowships and federal clerkships. I also took part in educational outings where I was able to meet New York federal and state judges to learn about their career paths and their roles in administering justice.
