## Fellowship Final Essay

This summer, I worked as a research Fellow for UDC's low income tax clinic. I worked on a special project to find suitable clients for low income tax clinics all over the country. I did that by going to the Tax Court house in D.C. and looking up case records in upcoming case dockets. Working in D.C. gave me a particular advantage to do this type of research because it is the only place it could be done.

I had seven dockets to work on and I completed data sheets for all the cases in the seven dockets. The data sheets are where I would put important information such as the petitioner's name, address, income and what the main issue of their case was. Sometimes this information would be difficult to find because there were so many documents in the case file, it would be difficult to search through them all.
