I have been on a few client calls regarding asylum hearings, green card application renewals, and DACA cases. I am excited to continue with this important work and see how my work impacts my clients later in the summer.

Update 2:

I'm officially 3 weeks into my internship and have been thoroughly enjoying the experience. I have been primarily working on affirmative asylum cases, U-Visa applications, and DACA applications. Last week, one of the highlights was hearing an attorney from The Legal Aid Society argue before the United States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit.

Update 3:

I also conducted research on the country conditions of the countries where the clients are seeking refuge from to add further evidence to the applicants' asylum declarations. I will be working with one client further as she has a young son who would qualify as a Special Immigrant Juvenile with USCIS. I am excited to continue this meaningful work!
