Update 1:

I work at Legal Assistance of Western New York and upon being hired, was designated to work half of my time with the LawNY housing and tenant unit (based in Ithaca) and the other half of my time will be committed to working for ProBono Net, which is internally affiliated with LawNy. For my work with LawNy, which is my primary source of assignments, my first week tasks consisted of mostly trainings, legal informational videos, and orientations. My first assignment was a content project to create an information flyer and an attorney training guide regarding ERAP (Emergency Assistance Rental Program). LawNY provides assistance to tenants and to attorney volunteers who deal closely with ERAP for their clients so the information would be helpful on their website. Additionally, I was assigned to shadow a staff attorney as she worked on a housing case dealing with a breach of contract claim. Specifically, I was able to sit in on a call and work on drafting a discovery letter. For ProBono Net, I have been assigned to work as a live help operator for the free chat function that they offer. My first tasks were learning how to use the platform and getting accustomed to the type of information I will be providing. I completed three sessions related to practice chatting. I also trained and completed two tasks related to plain language writing.

Update 2:

I am aiding in the distribution of legal access to many. By working as a live operator on the Live Help NY chat platform, I am spreading justice to people who are in need.
