Final Reflection:

As my Equal Justice America fellowship and summer internship with Legal Counsel for the Elderly come to a close, I have been reflecting on the incredible experiences and knowledge I have gained over the past few months.

Working with LCE has allowed me to contribute to the vital mission of protecting the rights and dignity of older adults in the District of Columbia. I have had the privilege of assisting clients in securing Medicare and Medicaid benefits, working on EPD waiver cases, researching legislative histories of statutory provisions, and drafting detailed legal memoranda to support advocacy efforts. Conducting home visits has given me firsthand insight into the unique challenges faced by our clients and highlighted the importance of meeting them where they are.
