### Final Reflection:

As I conclude my time as a Greenfield Fellow at the National Consumer Law Center this summer, I find myself reflecting on an experience that has been both professionally transformative and personally enriching. The breadth of legal work I encountered exceeded all expectations—from engaging in litigation across state and federal courts, witnessing trials firsthand, and drafting motions, to contributing sections of a federal appellate amicus brief, each experience deepened my understanding of consumer advocacy law and courtroom practice.
