Update 1:

I have truly been enjoying my time with the Community Revitalization Project of Legal Aid of Northwest Texas! I have had the opportunity to do some hands-on community lawyering opportunities that have solidified my dedication to public interest legal services. I had an opportunity to help the Dallas office with a Know Your Rights presentation to an apartment complex that was experiencing housing concerns. I have also attended multiple community events with concerns over data centers being constructed in my home city of Fort Worth, Texas. I have been digging into the environmental concerns they can cause, Texas environmental agency responses, and ways the law can ensure community protection for the residents of Fort Worth.

Update 2:

I am incredibly lucky to be working alongside Legal Aid of Northwest Texas. I have been spending my time meeting with community members who are discussing the environmental concerns they have for incoming data centers into the Fort Worth community. I have had more of an opportunity to bond with all of the attorneys in my office and am currently working on a white paper information sheet for data center solutions that will be granted to the community in Fort Worth and across north Texas.

Update 3:

I am loving my experience at LANWT's Community Revitalization Project! I am finishing up my data center white paper and preparing a community education presentation that will be shared with the people of Lubbock, Texas. I am also working on a report over the legality of discovery for AI prompts! I am really excited to keep growing alongside the team during my final weeks!



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Update 4:

During my set of final weeks before my internship came to a close, I spent some time wrapping up some projects that I spent time researching this summer. I finalized my research page for data center information that will be the basis for a community education presentation on data centers and environmental concerns in the city of Fort Worth. I also worked on a research project about what impact the LSC requirements have on our ability to host community education presentations regarding election information. Before I leave, I am helping lay the foundation for an education event discussing the history of the Voting Rights Act.

Final Reflection:

My time with the Community Revitalization Project of the Legal Aid of Northwest Texas (LANWT) has been incredible! I have grown so much as an advocate, community member, legal researcher, and future attorney. Alongside the attorneys of the office, I have been able to aid with drafting an amicus brief that was sent to the Supreme Court of Texas, attend community education events, research legal mechanisms on property preservation and acquisition, and do a deep dive on environmental impacts by data centers. Throughout this internship I solidified my decision to pursue a career in public interest. I was deeply inspired by the attorneys, paralegals, and other staff I have met.
